

It's Time to Pay Your Dues!

We have some great volunteer opportunities coming up for CPA members who are in "good standing"....which means you are up to date on your membership dues.

Yearly Individual dues are \$25, Lifetime Individual Membership is \$250, Yearly Family Membership dues are \$40 or a Lifetime Family Membership is \$400. You can pay by check (made out to PCPAAA). We can take cash as well but you should have correct change. We will also take payment in a Credit Card but you need to attend a meeting to get that taken care of.


Animal Services
