## SCAMS YOU NEED TO BE AWARE OF:

### WHAT IS A PHISHING SCAM?

Scammers use email or text messages to trick you into giving them your personal information.

How To Recognize Phishing;

- The email looks like its from a company you may know and trust, however, look at the “From” if it is from a *real* company email system like say Netflix, it probably has an email extension [of@netflix.com](mailto:of@netflix.com) on it. You might see @aol.com instead and that’s the tip off you needed to start suspecting it is a scam email
- The email says your account is on hold because of a problem, click on the box to “UPDATE ACCOUNT NOW”. Don’t fall for this one.....if you are not sure log into the business website, enter your account/password and check to see if your account is up to date.
- Don’t update anything from an email telling you to.
- The email has a generic greeting, “Hi Dear”. If you have an account with the business, it probably wouldn’t use a generic greeting like this.
- The email invites you to click on a link to update your payment details.....NEVER update from an email link or button in the email!

### WHAT ABOUT GETTING AN EMAIL FROM A “FRIEND” OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW?

- The email might start off in the subject: “I NEED YOUR HELP” or “Could you please spare a minute to assist me in completing a task discreetly” - *ask yourself why they would be emailing instead of calling?*
- Please reply by email since I’m in a meeting – *if it’s an emergency wouldn’t they leave a meeting?*
- Please send 5-\$100 iTune cards to help me out - *really...iTune cards to help you out?*
- Look at the recipient emails name or address – *is it really from your friend’s email address that they use all the time?*
- Look at the salutation, is that a phrase they use? - *“Sincerely” when you know they sign off with “Kind Regards”*
- Ask yourself, why would your friend be asking for iTune cards?
- Is the name at the bottom of the email spelled right? They should clearly know how to spell their own name.
- Many times, if a scam from a friend is sent from a cellphone, it will have the carriers information such as *iPhone* or *Android*, do you know your friend well enough to know they have that type of phone?
- Look every part of the email over carefully and questions anything out of the ordinary before you provide what the email requests! When it doubt, call your friend and ask them about the request!

# OFFICER OF THE MONTH

This month's officer is Tim Hicks who is currently working in the Special Investigations Unit (SIU).

Tim was born July 3<sup>rd</sup> 1988 in Texas City, Texas and was raised in Houston. He graduated from Dobie High School as a Longhorn in 2006 and then graduated from the Houston Community College Police Academy in 2010.

Tim married his wife, Paige on October 12<sup>th</sup> 2018. They have three darling children, Matthew who is twelve years old, Christopher who is eight years old, and Haley who is five years old. The rest of the family consists of Gus a German Shepherd , Motley a mutt, Otto a cat (who hitched a ride in Tim's truck), and Pig and Noodle who are guinea pigs.

His future plans are to continue his development as a detective and promote within the Police Department. In the future he has plans to travel domestically through the United States and also see places around the world.

What led him to this career was he wanted to help people and does not like seeing citizens being victimized. He prefers putting burglars and thieves in jail.

Tim's law enforcement career started when he worked at the Galveston County Jail in 2006. He then came to work in the Pearland Police Department Jail in 2008. After becoming a police officer he initially worked at Friendswood Police Department starting in 2011. That eventually led him to coming to the Pearland Police Department in 2017. Tim's qualifications include Field Training Officer (FTO), Intoxilyzer operator and drone operator.

He remembers his impact moment like it was yesterday even though it occurred when he was working at Friendswood nearly a decade ago. Tim was dispatched to a missing person call. He arrived at the location and spoke with the family and learned their 15 year old daughter was missing. He found out that a year or two earlier she had been a sexual assault victim. The suspect had been released on probation on a lesser charge at that time. Tim discovered the suspect was living in Dickinson. Tim found the missing girl at the suspect's house and was being further victimized by the suspect. He was able to recover the missing girl and return her to her parents and arrest the sexual predator suspect.

## VOLUNTEER HOURS

As a reminder, all volunteer hours should be turned in to Janet, Crissie Emmons at: [janetcrissie@gmail.com](mailto:janetcrissie@gmail.com).

In the email you should break down the volunteer hours in the following way:

**Inside** – volunteer opportunity is inside the PPD or parking lot area at the PPD

**Outside** – you are volunteering some place other than then PPD such as a city event, another building, etc.

**COPS** – Handicap Patrol

Crissie just needs totals for each of those categories and does not need the dates.

Meetings count as “inside” hours. If you volunteer with Animal Control those would be “Outside” hours. If you are volunteering with TSA K9 Decoy that would also be “Outside” hours. The only hours that don’t count are ride-alongs with officers. That is for your enjoyment and serves no purpose of volunteering.

Officer Rogers gets calls from the City of Pearland asking about our volunteer hours periodically and he gives them a count he has gotten from Crissie. Volunteer hours are used for many things including reporting to state, possibly getting new vehicles such as the van we have, insurance if one of us got hurt while volunteering. At the end of the year we hand out volunteer pins to our membership when you hit certain milestones.

Did you know that according to the *thenonproffitimes.com* volunteer hours are worth \$28.54/hr in 2020.

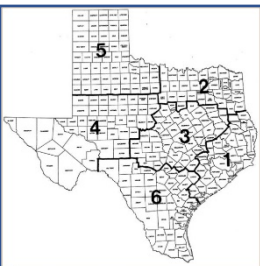
