

Noah's career started with Pearland Police Department in December 2019.


What led Noah to this career path was his desire to have a more family friendly environment then the military and his willingness to continue serving others in his community.

## VOLUNTEER HOURS

In the email you should break down the volunteer hours in the following way:

**Inside** – volunteer opportunity is inside the PPD or parking lot area at the PPD

**Outside** – you are volunteering some place other than then PPD such as a city event, another building, etc.

**COPS** – Handicap Patrol

Crissie just needs totals for each of those categories and does not need the dates.

Meetings count as "inside" hours. If you volunteer with Animal Control those would be "Outside" hours. If you are volunteering with TSA K9 Decoy that would also be "Outside" hours. The only hours that don't count are ride-alongs with officers. That is for your enjoyment and serves no purpose of volunteering.

Officer Rogers gets calls from the City of Pearland asking about our volunteer hours periodically and he gives them a count he has gotten from Crissie. Volunteer hours are used for many things including reporting to state, possibly getting new vehicles such as the van we have, insurance if one of us got hurt while volunteering. At the end of the year, we hand out volunteer pins to our membership when you hit certain milestones.


