SOS on your Smart Phones

Recently, a female Pearland resident was assaulted in the Morgan Road and Magnolia Parkway area while walking her dog. Using the **Emergency SOS** feature on her phone, she was able to call 911 and get free from the suspect. The Pearland Police Department were dispatched immediately and she was able to give a description. Utilizing the **SOS Emergency** feature to contact 911 may have saved her life. Here are some tips to assist you in setting up this feature on your phone.

iPhone "Emergency SOS" feature:

If you own an iPhone 8 or later (that's if your phone came out after 2017) you can activate the "SOS" feature as follows:

1) Hold down the side button on the right and BOTH volume buttons on the left at the same time. A slider will appear on your screen that says, "Emergency SOS". Slide across the SOS Emergency icon and your phone will make an immediate call to the emergency services in your area.

Android – "SOS Feature":

- 1) Go to Settings Advanced features Send "SOS messages" turn feature "ON"
- 2) Press the Power key 3 to 4 times (depending on your settings).
- 2) Auto call someone identify person.
- 3) Attach pictures.
- 4) Attach audio recording.
- 5) Send message to your selected someone.

These features may also be available on some models of Apple, Samsung and Garmin Watches. When in doubt about how to set this type of feature up on your specific phone or watch, "Google" your phone or watch model for more details and specific information/instructions for your particular model.



CPA Member Reflects on the Recent Texas Region One Meeting

It's Saturday morning and I'm looking for a police training center with older homes on one side and huge industrial plants on the other. The Deer Park CPA Alumni Association is hosting this month's Texas CPAAA Region One meeting at their new training facility and it's my first time to attend.

Pearland, Deer Park and many other area CPA Alumni Associations are members of Region One. Because of that, any PCPAAA member can join the meetings held on the second Saturday of each month. Each meeting is hosted by a different organization (Pearland hosts in November). I'm not the only Pearland member here in Deer Park... I'm joined by Dave & Sandy Miller and Delores Grant at this event. (Dave jokes that he had to twist my arm, but truth be told it wasn't twisted that hard. I'm always interested to learn how we can support our police, in Pearland specifically, but also throughout the Houston area and Texas.)

By 9:00 AM, when I arrived, the room was pretty full with lots of conversations, greetings of familiar faces, and flowing coffee & orange juice to go with the donuts, kolaches and breakfast tacos.

Each meeting has a presentation component prior to the business meeting. This one kicked off around 9:15 with a moving video and introduction of this morning's speaker, Cheryl Railsback.

Speaker - Cheryl Railsback, COPS

Cheryl is the Western Region Trustee for Concerns of Police Survivors (COPS). COPS Chapters (55 in the US) support surviving family members and coworkers affected by line of duty death. Cheryl shared her personal story of the death of her son Chambers County Sheriff's Deputy Shane Detwiler (EOW 7/13/2009) and then how many of the services provided by COPS helped her in the aftermath of his passing.

COPS provides retreats for spouses, children, parents and coworkers throughout the year. They also send as many as possible to Washington D.C. every year for National Police Week (moved to October this year due to Covid restrictions in D.C.). The local chapters also participate in recognizing Texas officers in Austin every year. With Covid affecting our first responders, over 40 Texas officers were honored this year. Unlike some other organizations, COPS includes families and coworkers of officers lost to medical reasons, such as Covid, as well as line of duty deaths.

Business Meeting

After Cheryl's presentation, and Deer Park presenting a cross and donation to the COPS organization, the Region One business meeting kicked off. In addition to regular and new business, it was very interesting to hear about the other CPA Alumni Associations in the area and the activities they are planning or participating in. Deer Park, Pasadena and La Porte are teaming up to hold a sanctioned BBQ cookoff later this year as a Back the Blue fundraiser. Many others are just starting to hold in person meetings again.

State Convention

There was quite a bit of conversation and activity around the state convention. State convention is July 28-31, 2021 in Plano, TX (a suburb of Dallas). Information and the latest schedule can be found at texascpaaa.net/convention. There are lots of great sessions on the schedule on topics like personal safety, mental health, property safety and family & workplace violence. The high profile cases look particularly interesting with Detective Eric Barnes presenting a murder for hire case, and Tim Miller from Texas Equusearch. I've already registered and am really looking forward to the event. I hope to see many of you there as well!


