The atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki took place 77 years ago, on August 6 and August 9, 1945, respectively. The U.S. bombed Japan towards the end of the Second World War, prompting the Japanese to surrender on August 15, 1945, bringing the conflict to an end. The first atomic bomb—known as "Little Boy"—was dropped on Hiroshima by a modified B-29 bomber christened Enola Gay, after the mother of its pilot, Colonel Paul Tibbets. The 9,000-pound uranium-235 bomb was dropped at 8.15 a.m local time, exploding 2,000 feet above Hiroshima. The blast was equal to 12-15,000 tons of TNT and destroyed five square miles of the city. Three days later, a plutonium bomb known as "Fat Man" was loaded on a B-29 bomber called Bockscar, which was flown by Major Charles Sweeney. The initial target was the city of Kokura, but because of thick clouds, the bomb was dropped on the secondary target of Nagasaki. This second bomb weighed nearly 10,000 pounds and produced a 22-kiloton blast. A little something for the history buffs out there.

On a personal note, after ten (10) days I finally passed my kidney stone. Definitely thought a nuclear bomb had gone off on my insides!

Enjoy what little time remains before the school zones start back up and don't text and drive!




