This month's officer is **Sergeant Alex Watkins** who is currently working B Squad's day shift in C district.

Alex was born December 14th 1989 in Houston where he grew up. He completed his high school education at the Seaborn Challenge Corps which has a military school environment at which he graduated from in 2006. He graduated from Sam Houston State University in 2020 with a Bachelor of Science degree in criminal justice.

Alex is the single father of two sons, Nathan 10 years of age and Keith 6 years of age.

Alex spent four years in the Navy as a machinist mate, with two deployments to the Western Pacific and one deployment to the Pacific Rim. He served onboard the USS Cleveland which was used to transport Marine Expeditionary Forces.

What led him into a law enforcement career was when Alex decided one day to "step off of the sidelines" and make a difference in all of the problems that he was seeing and hearing about in the news. He attended the Pasadena Police Academy and was in the first group sent there by the Pearland Police Department. Alex started with Pearland Police Department in April 2015.

Some of Alex's hobbies are hunting, fishing, swimming, learning to fly a helicopter, learning to play the piano, and taking care of his pet cat Napoleon who is six years old. Alex's future plans are to eventually retire from the Pearland Police Department and to pursue a Master's Degree or a Law Degree.

A good impact moment is every time citizens, especially children thank him for being an officer. That gives him a level of satisfaction that reminds Alex why he pursued a career in law enforcement in the first place. His least favorite moment was being the first on the scene of a double fatality motorcycle accident involving two very young people.
