OFFICER SPOTLIGHT

This month's officer is Sergeant Tim Madrid who is a sergeant in CID currently assigned over the crimes against persons unit. He has 16 years of law enforcement experience, all in Pearland. He has 10 years on bike patrol, and 15 years on the honor guard where he has traveled from coast to coast to take part in various events. He is also swift water certified and currently is assistant commander of the new WAT (Warrant Apprehension Team) unit.

Tim was born January 20th 1982 at Cannon AFB near Clovis New Mexico. That night they came back to Texas, and he has been in Texas ever since. He graduated from Muleshoe High School in 2000. He has an associate's degree in English Literature from Blinn College in 2004. Tim acquired a Bachelor degree in Criminal Justice from Sam Houston State College in 2007.

Tim and his wife Lea were married on the beach in Saint Lucia in 2014. She is a traveling nurse and flies all over the United States. They have a son Cooper who 13 years old and is an aspiring amateur chef.

While attending Blinn College he met some officers from Bryan Texas, and after talking to them he decided that being an officer sounded more exciting than being a coach. He had no prior plans to become a police officer, and has never regretted the career path he went down.

Tim's hobby is primarily taking care of Rambo which is a black and tan European Doberman puppy that is one year old and full of energy. When he retires from his career here, he plans on visiting Europe along with Reykjavik Iceland, and New Zealand. He will settle down somewhere in the hill country.

Tim's impact moment also included his wife ultimately in part of it. As a rookie officer he arrested a young man on possession of marijuana charges and had a conversation with him while driving him to the jail. He thanked Tim for treating him with respect and dignity even though he was under arrest. A few years later he became a trainer at Tim's gym and let him know he had turned his life around and introduce Tim to his wife and kids. Two years ago Tim was called by his wife who was frantic. She had stopped to help an unconscious man in a burning vehicle on 288, but they couldn't get him out and feared he would burn alive. His wife called him back and said the kid he had arrested years before stopped because he recognized Lea as his wife. He was able to break out the window and with his passenger they pulled the man out and saved his life.

To present to the SRO officers of whom there are so few.

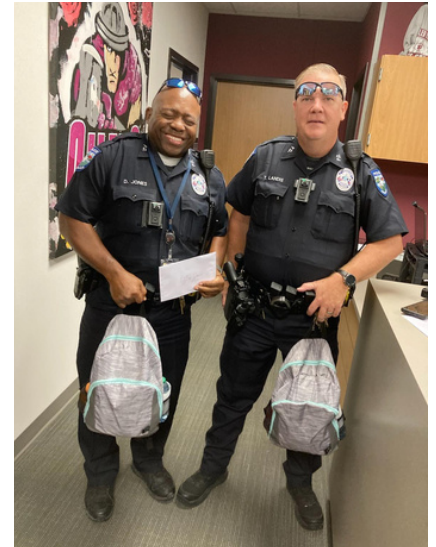
There was much appreciation expressed for all your hard work
